

JAZZ HISTORY

Jazz is a form of American music that started in African American communities in the early 1900s. It combines European and African musical traditions to create a sound that uses multiple rhythms, improvisation, and syncopation. Jazz has many styles, such as New Orleans Dixieland, big-band-style swing, bebop, and a variety of Latin jazz and fusion.

JAZZ - A form of american music that started in the early 1900s.

TRUMPET - A brass instrument that creates a golden, rich sound.

- The Barnyard Band used music to raise money to rebuild the barn what else can music do for us?


