Julia Donaldson has written some of the world's best-loved children's books, including modern classics The Gruffalo and The Gruffalo's Child, which together have sold over 17 million copies worldwide, and the hugely successful What the Ladybird Heard adventures. She was the UK Children's Laureate 2011-13 and has been honored with a CBE for Services to Literature.

Axel Scheffler is the best-selling, award-winning illustrator of many of the world's favorite picture books. Born in Hamburg, Axel moved to England over thirty years ago to study illustration. Axel has also illustrated novelty titles for younger readers such as Noisy Farm and The Bedtime Bear, as well as the Pip and Posy series. Axel lives in London with his partner and daughter.

How was the musical different from the books? How were they similar?



Costumes are used to help actors look like the character they are playing.


For example, the actor playing the owl wears feathers and wings so the audience knows who he is.

HAPPY HABITATS




Mouse wants to scare away other animals by inventing a MONSTER like the Gruffalo. If you were to scare away animals, what kind of monster would you invent?

Use scissors to cut along the dotted lines and separate the finger puppets. Ask an adult to help you with this.


Pick a character and wrap the band around your finger. There is a band at the bottom of each character, and it has a little circle and square in it.
